REQUIREMENTS

According to the <u>CEC Screening Policy</u>, the Head Routesetter and the Assistant Head Routesetter positions are ranked "Level 2 - Medium Risk" positions. Therefore, the following requirements must be completed prior to performing the duties at the event:

- 1. Have a valid 2021-2022 CEC License (athlete, coach, or officials license)
- 2. Complete the online CEC Volunteer Registration Form when requested by CEC
- 3. Provide an Enhanced Police Information Check (E-PIC) when invited to do so by CEC
- 4. Safe Sport & Ethics Training
 - a. Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders; OR
 - b. CAC Safe Sport Training
- 5. Concussion Awareness training Making Head Way in Sport
- 6. Return a signed copy of the <u>CEC Concussion Pre-Season Education Sheet</u>
- 7. Read and remain up to date on all CEC and IFSC rules and regulations.

^{*}Head Routesetter is paid one (1) extra day for preparation prior to the event.

Compensation includes:

- Travel expenses as booked and/or approved by the CEC Coordinator
- Accommodation as booked and/or approved by the CEC Coordinator
 - Successful candidates are expected to share a double occupancy room with another official of the same gender identification
- Food per diem (\$40/working day)
- Contract fee for the length of event as follows:

SELECTION PROCESS

The selection committee for Routesetting positions for the CEC Senior events is as follows:

- CEC Competition Committee

The selection committee will review all applications using the following criteria in order of importance:

First Priority Criteria – Head Routesetter

- 1. International setting experience
 - a. IFSC Sanctioned events above the national level
- 2. National setting experience
 - a. Previous experience as Head Setter
 - b. 5 experiences as an Assistant Head Routesetter
- 3. Other competition experience, setting and competing
- 4. Knowledge of the Canadian competitive field



First Priority Criteria – Assistant Head Routesetter

- 1. Potential for growth into the role of Head Routesetter in the near future
- 2. Setting experiences in the discipline being applied for
 - a. 2 setting experiences as a full setter at nationals or higher.
 - b. 2 setting experiences as Head Routesetter for a provincial level event.
- 3. Other competition experience, setting and competing.
- 4. Knowledge of the Canadian competitive field.

Second Priority Criteria – both roles

- 1. Knowledge of the current IFSC rules and regulations
- 2. Potential for growth as a Routesetter
- 3. Ability to mentor apprentice future Head Routesetters during the event (Head position)
- 4. Canadian Resident or Citizen, located in Canada
- 5. Proximity to the event host facility
